

Museum Guidelines for Visitors

The Parliamentary Museum is located on the First Floor Lobby of the National Assembly Building. To ensure maximum enjoyment of all visitors to the Museum, the visitors must follow these important guidelines:

- **Opening Hours.** The Museum is opened from 0800hrs to 1600hrs on working days (Mondays to Fridays) only. All visitors must submit their bags at the Security Checkpoint upon their arrival at the National Assembly Building and also go through the Security screening (*this is a normal parliamentary Procedure and will not cause any body harm to visitors*)
- **Viewing of the Museum.** All Visitors are welcome to view the Museum individually or in groups. Visitors in big groups (10+ pax) are encouraged to notify the National Assembly of their visits in advance and officers will be happy to provide guided tour of the Museum. Any requests for guided tour must be submitted to the National Assembly at least **(2) two** days in advance.
- **Please do not touch.** While your touch may seem harmless, touching of the works will damage the surface over time. Please help us preserve the collections for future generations by not touching the displays except the Touch Screens!
- **Food or drink is not permitted in the Museum.**
- **Smoking is not permitted.**
- **Guests are welcome to use cell phones in the Museum but put it on silent.** (*The National Assembly is a working Environment*)
- **For the safety of other guests and the collections we do not allow running or unruly behavior.**
- **Photography and filming of the Museum's collection are permitted** for personal use. Tripods, additional lighting, and photography for professional and commercial use are not permitted unless approval has been sought from the National Assembly.

- **Sketching is permitted.** Adults may use graphite, colored pencils, crayons and or non-loading pens. Children accompanied by adults may use pencils and colored pencils.
- **Our Security Officers** patrol throughout the Museum to assist guests, and of course protect the collections.
